What we believe:

We are a church in the contemporary Anglican tradition, and part of the Anglican Diocese of Grafton, and therefore base our worship on the Prayer Book (APBA) and the Bible. 

We have a strong and enthusiastic lay leadership team who work well together.


Our newly recommenced Holy Trinity Play group is well supported by young mothers.

A Little About South West Rocks and Environs

A Stunning Holiday Hub

South West Rocks is one of NSW's best-kept secrets, a pocket of tranquility on the Mid North Coast of NSW, at the mouth of the Macleay River. The area has stunning beaches, beautiful nature



trails, National Parks and a well-preserved history. Its waters attract fishermen and scuba divers from all over the world, while its string of beaches lined with Norfolk pines promise sun and surf without the crowds of better-known holiday hubs.



A Growth Area

South West Rocks has been identified as a key locality for housing delivery and urban growth. The 2023 population of 5,818 is forecast to grow at an average of 2.2% per annum increasing to 8,477 people in 2041. Another 2,375 are resident in the Smithtown - Hat Head - Gladstone District. (Source: North Coast

Regional Plan 2041, prepared by the NSW Department of Planning)

Census figures (2021) showed that 4.2% of the population were babies and pre-schoolers, 11.1% were school age, 37.6% were in the work force, 19.4 were 'empty-nesters' and retirees (ages 60 to 69) and 27.8% were seniors and elderly (over 70). In recent years, the largest changes in the age structure in this area were in the age groups of Seniors (aged 70 to 84) and Young Workforce (aged 25 to 34).



South West Rocks is a 3½-hour drive to Newcastle. Many residents work and shop in Kempsey, 30 mins away, or Port Macquarie, 1-hour drive south. A choice of three high schools is available in Kempsey. Various medical centres and community Health services are available in South West Rocks and the Kempsey District Hospital is an 81 bed, level three facility with a level four 24-hour Emergency Department and a range of specialist services.

ANGLICAN PARISH OF LOWER MACLEAY

The Anglican Parish of Lower Macleay is within the Kempsey Local Government Area and includes South West Rocks, and Jerseyville, Smithtown, Hat Head and Gladstone villages. Within the parish there are <u>two</u> centres of worship:

Holy Trinity, South West Rocks.

McIntyre Street, South West Rocks

We welcome around 30-40 people on Sundays for a service that's based upon the prayer book (APBA), but is contemporary in style, with an emphasis on clear and relevant Bible



teaching and worshipping together in communion. Our music is a mix of contemporary and traditional hymns and is led by our talented keyboard player and singer.

Our Lay Leaders lead the service with support and input from other parishioners. Most weeks we share together at the Lord's Table as a culminating act of our journey of communion.

We love welcoming people of all ages and backgrounds, and have a lounge for nursing mums, a toddler friendly area, and activity packs for use during the service and to take home, for younger and older kids. After the service we stay for morning tea and a friendly chat.

Our Parish Hall is attached behind Holy Trinity and is an important asset for the Parish. It is a large airconditioned hall equipped with kitchen, toilets, office and storage for the Op Shop and the Holy Trinity Playgroup. It is well set up for the Playgroup to meet every Friday and is also hired out for community activities.

Hat Head Village Church (Christ

Church) 53 Straight St, Hat Head

Christ Church provides a great informal country atmosphere and a small but friendly mixed-age group, in a tiny classic Aussie bush church. We join in a relaxed service singing a mix of traditional & contemporary songs, read and discuss the Bible, pray for each other and the



world, and usually celebrate the Lord's Supper together.

Note: Christ Church, Hat Head is subject to a review under the Diocesan Restructuring for Ministry and Mission plan.

The Nicholl Centre is located behind the Hat Head church and is used for the Hat Head Op Shop/Garage Sales and is available to the community for hire.

The **Anglicare Mobile Food Pantry** visits on the second Tuesday of the month, 12.30 -1.30 pm.



Parish Groups and Activities

South West Rocks Op Shop staffed by a wonderful group of volunteers, this Op




Shop is a major outreach and community asset and source of revenue for the Parish. Each year volunteers choose a number of local organizations to share in a donation of \$4000.

Hat Head Nicholl Centre Op Shop/Garage Sales – Tuesdays and Saturdays - A valued community asset.

Holy Trinity Play Group every Friday in the Church Hall. Led by local mums. Currently, we have 17 mothers and 24 children listed.
